Bright Futures Scholarship Information

ATTENTION PARENTS: LBHS seniors will go to the Media Center the week of December 7th to sign up for Bright Futures Scholarships. It is imperative that each student has his/her CORRECT social security number at that time. Students will be notified in late June of their status. FCAT Changes

Due to budget reductions at the state level the Florida Department of Education has made changes to the FCAT Assessment Program. The FCAT Summer Retake for juniors and seniors has been eliminated. Florida statute states that students will have "multiple opportunities" to retake the Grade 10 tests required for graduation. With no summer option, a student will still have five opportunities to take the test(s) prior to graduation. It is important for parents to keep the individual student paper report, as it will be the only source of student score information available to parents.

College Transcript Hard Copies

As of March 2009, the district discontinued the sending of hard copies of test scores to colleges/universities. Students will be required to send their test scores via U.S. mail with their transcript. When transcripts are sent electronically, they will contain test scores.

Turning in your completed community service forms to guidance before winter break, will allow the state to determine initial eligibility for the 100% Bright Future Scholarship in the first round of evaluations.

Advanced Placement Course Reminders

Advanced Placement courses offer students an opportunity to experience the rigor of college classes at the high school level. Successful completion of advanced placement courses enables students to receive a weighted grade for the class. In addition, scores of 3, 4, or 5 on the national exam could result in college credit. A student will have the opportunity to receive the above mentioned benefits if the following criteria are met:

1. a grade of C or greater earned in the class.
2. the student sits for the national exam.
3. the student arrives prior to the doors closing for commencement of exam procedures.
4. the student exerts full effort while completing the exam (sleeping is not permitted).
5. the student's exam has not been invalidated.

Invalidation of an exam could result when any of the following occur:

1. talking during the testing period.
2. sharing of information during the testing period.
3. use of inappropriate and/or unauthorized materials during the testing period.
4. use of electronic devices during the testing period.
5. any behavior that compromises the integrity of the test and/or testing process.

Rachel's Challenge

On Friday, **October 16, 2009**, many students attended the Rachel's Challenge assembly. Rachel's Challenge is a program based on the thoughts, ideas and writings of Rachel Scott who was the first student killed in the tragic Columbine High School shooting 10 years ago. Shortly after Rachel's death, her parents found an essay she had written challenging her readers to show kindness and compassion to one another. Rachel wrote, "You will never know how far a little kindness can go to changing the world." Her father has brought her message to the world and our students want to see how much they can change the world through kindness. We now have a new club on campus, F.O.R., Friends of Rachel, in which we are going to make an impact on our school, community, and globally by implementing Rachel's Challenge. In the coming weeks you might be approached by a student doing a random act of kindness for you. He will then give you a kindness card and explain what the card is and how it works. The cards are 4 for \$10.00 and all the money is sent to the Rachel's Challenge organization to help feed starving children and pay for children to get cleft palate and cleft lip surgery. When you do an act of kindness for a person you give them a card and explain how they can go on line to register the card so that it can be tracked. In return for the kindness you ask them to do something nice for someone else and to keep passing the card along and have it registered each time. This way we will know how far a little kindness can go. Some cards have been tracked as far as England and Australia. The students are very excited about being able to make a difference globally and we appreciate all the community support we can get. As usual, our Patriots make the difference!

The goal of CFE and the Brantley Branch is to increase financial literacy and offer a convenient way for students to manage their money.
